## DID YOU KNOW?

This Sunday, Aug. 28 is the Feast Day of Saint Augustine, Bishop, and Doctor of the Church. He is one of the most influential Church Fathers and theologians in history. Who was he and why is he so famous? Here are a few things to know and share about him....

St. Augustine was born in A.D. 354 in Numidia (modern day Algeria) into an upper-class family. His father Patricius was a pagan, who converted to Christianity on his deathbed. His mother St. Monica was a Christian and raised Augustine in the faith, but he was not baptized until he was an adult. As a boy he became conscious of sin when he participated in a pointless act of theft. Where he lived there was a garden with a pear tree loaded with fruit. Late one night he and a group of bad youngsters set out to rob the tree of the fruit. They took the fruit, not to eat, but to throw it to the pigs, they did this to do what pleased them. and they loved it. When he was nineteen, he began a long-term affair with a woman. We do not know her name, because Augustine deliberately did not record it. She was not of Augustine's social class, and he never married her. She did, however, give Augustine a son, who he named Adeodatus (Latin, "Gift of God"). This naming indicates an awareness that, no matter how a child is conceived, and even if the parents did something very wrong, every child is a gift of God. Despite his Christian upbringing, Augustine abandoned the Faith and became a Manichean, which crushed his mother. Manicheanism was a Gnostic, dualistic sect founded in the A.D. 200s by an Iranian man named Mani. **Thus far, Augustine has stolen pears just to be naughty, had a long-term affair, fathered a child outside of wedlock, and abandoned the Christian Faith. Things aren't going so well for him on the becoming-a-saint front.** Augustine took a position teaching in Milan, and with the encouragement of his mother, began to have more contact with Christians and Christian literature. One day, he heard a childlike voice chanting "Tolle, lege" (Latin, "Take, read"). He took this as a divine command and opened the Bible, randomly, to Romans 13:13-14, which reads: *Let us conduct ourselves becomingly as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.* Applying this to his own life, his conversion now began in earnest and at the next Easter Vigil St. Ambrose of Milan baptized both Augustine and his son Adeodatus. Augustine, Monica and Adeodatus prepared to return to North Africa and. unfortunately, Monica only made it as far as Ostia, the port of Rome, where she died. In Africa, Adeodatus passed away also, and this left Augustine alone on the family property. He sold his possessions and gave the money to the poor. He did, however, retain the family house, which he turned into a monastery. In 391, he was ordained a priest of the diocese of Hippo and later became the coadjutor bishop and then its bishop. As bishop, he wrote extensively (in fact, he wrote *fantastically*), and the value of his writings was such that he became a Church Father. Augustine passed to his heavenly reward on Aug. 28, 430 (hence his feast day of Aug. 28). Unfortunately, after his death vandals burned the city, but they left Augustine's cathedral and library untouched. He was canonized and together with Gregory the Great, Ambrose, and Jerome, Augustine was one of the original four doctors of the Church. He was proclaimed a doctor of the Church because of the extraordinarily high value of his writings, which include major theological, philosophical, and spiritual works. Among his most famous works are: The Confessions (his spiritual autobiography), The City of God, On Christian Doctrine, Handbook on Faith, Hope, and Love. This is just a *tiny* selection of what he wrote. He could not *stop* writing! A large selection of his writings can be found online.

**So why not look for his writings online and find out more about this Saint that a mother never gave up on.**

## Sabían?

Este domingo 28 de agosto es la Festividad de San Agustín, Obispo, y Doctor de la Iglesia. El es uno de los más influenciados Padres y teólogos en la historia de la Iglesia Católica. Quién era él y por qué es tan famoso? Aquí se presentan algunas cosas para conocer y compartir... San Agustín nació en el año 354 A.D. en Numidia (en el tiempo actual Algeria) dentro de una familia de clase alta. Su padre Patricio era un hombre pagano, quien se convirtió al Cristianismo en su lecho de muerte. Su madre, Santa Mónica era Cristiana Católica y educó a San Agustín dentro de la Fe, pero no fue bautizado sino hasta que fue adulto. De niño y joven era consciente del pecado ya que participó en actos de robo. Donde vivía había un jardín con árboles de peras. Por la noche él y un grupo de jóvenes malos se robaron las frutas del árbol. Tomaron las frutas, no para comérselas, sino, para tirárselas a los cerdos, lo hicieron solo por gusto, y disfrutaron el hacerlo. A los 19 años Agustín tuvo amoríos con una mujer por bastante tiempo. No conocemos su nombre porque Agustín deliberadamente lo omitió. Ella no era de la clase social de Agustín y, nunca se casó con ella. Pero, sin embargo ella le dió un hijo, al que nombró Adeodatus (Latín, "Regalo de Dios"). Este nombre nos indica de que, no importa cómo haya sido concebido un niño y, que aunque, los padres hicieron algo muy erróneo, cada niño es un regalo de Dios. A pesar de haber sido criado como cristiano, Agustín abandonó la fe y se convirtió en Manichean, lo que destruyó a su madre. Manicheanism era una secta Agnóstica dualística fundada en el 200 año A.D. por un hombre Iraní llamado Mani. **Hasta ahora, Agustín ha robado peras y ha tenido amoríos con una mujer, tuvo un hijo fuera del matrimonio y abandono la Fe Cristiana. Las cosas no pintan bien para que él se convierta en un Santo.** Agustín aceptó un trabajo enseñando en Milán, y con el apoyo de su madre, comenzó a tener más contacto con cristianos católicos y con literatura Cristiana Católica. Un día, escuchó una voz como de niño cantando "Tolle, lege" (Latin, "Toma, lee"). Tomó esto como una orden divina y abrió la Biblia al azar, en Romanos 13:13-14, el cual dice: *Comportémonos con decencia, como a plena luz: nada de banquetes y borracheras, nada de lujuria y vicios, nada de pleitos y envidias. Más bien revístanse del Señor Jesucristo, y no se dejen arrastrar por la carne para satisfacer sus deseos.* Aplicando esto a su vida, su conversión ahora comenzó de manera seria y en la siguiente Vigilia de Pascua San Ambrosio de Milán bautizó a ambos a San Agustín y a su hijo Adeodatus. Santa Mónica, San Agustín y Adeodatus se prepararon para regresar al norte de África pero, desafortunadamente, Santa Mónica solo llegó a Ostia, el puerto de Roma, donde falleció. En África, Adeodatus también falleció, dejando a San Agustín solo en la propiedad de la familia. El vendió sus posesiones y repartió el dinero entre los pobres. Pero, retuvo la casa familiar, la cual, convirtió en un monasterio. En el año 391, fue ordenado Sacerdote en la Diócesis de Hippo y más tarde se hizo 'curate/ayudante' del Obispo y después Obispo. Como Obispo, escribió extensivamente (mejor dicho, escribió fantásticamente), y el valor de sus escritos fue tan valioso que se convirtió en Padre de la Iglesia. San Agustín fue a recibir su recompensa celestial o sea, falleció el 28 de Agosto, 430 (por eso su Festividad es el 28 de Agosto). Desafortunadamente, vándalos quemaron la ciudad pero, dejaron sin tocar la Catedral de San Agustín y su Biblioteca. Fue canonizado y junto con San Gregorio el Grande, San Ambrosio, y San Jerónimo, San Agustín fue uno de los cuatro originales Doctores de la Iglesia Católica. Fue proclamado Doctor de la Iglesia por el Extraordinario y Gran Valor de sus Escritos, los cuales incluyen grandes trabajos Teológicos, Filosóficos y, Espirituales. Entre sus más famosos escritos se encuentran: 'Las Confesiones' (su autobiografía espiritual), 'La Ciudad de Dios', 'En Doctrina Cristiana', 'Notas en la Fe, Esperanza y Amor'. Esta es solo una pequeñísima selección de lo que San Agustín escribió. El *no podía dejar* de escribir! Una gran selección de sus escritos se pueden encontrar en internet. Por qué no buscar sus escritos en línea y conocer más acerca de este Santo, el cual, tuvo una madre que nunca dejó de rezar por él.
